Lou Bailey & daughter Ethel
After his death - Ethel now Mrs Cooper
Husband William took it on. 2 daughters June and Iris

1950's - Teddy & Ivy Howard Poultry business 2 sons Peter & Leonard and 1 daughter Valerie

Mr & Mrs Herbert Pratt car mechanic took it on. Had 2 daughters

The pub closed in 1958 and was sold for a private house to Mr & Mrs Vic & Doreen Mason. 1 daughter Lesley Dawn. Vic Mason car mechanic and later at RAF Neatishead - retired 1983.

New house built (section 1)1990's by Ray & Sue Wymer (ground was from smallholding of Miss Neales in 1980's) Millbeck built in summer 1990 Pauline & Martin Venier bought house. Sold in 2006 to David Turner & Ms Yvonne Bullimore. House up for sale June 2008.

Smallholding - owned by Ian Paterson
Rented by Ernest (dealer) and Eveline Neal 1 son George and 1 daughter Irene.
After their deaths Irene took it on. Sold by Ian Paterson and split into 4 sections in 1980's.
Barn bought by Trevor Hardingham (builders) to convert.
(Section 2)Mr Herbert Frederic & Mrs Jenwyn Lucy King bought Invicta Lodge on 10 December 1998 Mr H F King died 2002.
Adjoining house, (Section 3)Willow Farm bought by Norman & Hazel Chalk and part of ground. 2 sons. (Section 4) Part of field kept by Patersons (building permission for bungalows refused access)
John and Shiela Houchen now live at Willow Farm.
